FLAMENCO EGG COZIES ENGLISH





Hello Happy Crocheter!

These cheerful egg cozies will keep your freshly boiled eggs warm, while adding color and cheer to your table!

I crocheted them using Scheepjes Colour Crafter yarn in different colors and a hook size E-4 / 3.5 mm.

Lots of crochet fun!

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Materials

•Scheepjes "Colour Crafter" yarn,100% premium acrylic, 300 m in 100 grams (DK weight).

Please choose different colors to your liking to crochet the different sections of the egg cozy. You can also base your choice of colors on the various photographs in this pattern.

- •crochet hook size E4 (3.5 mm) •yarn needle
- •some toy stuffing or fiberfill

Crochet symbols and abbreviations

- slip stitch (ss)
- chain (ch)
- + single crochet (sc)
- f double crochet (dc)
- ✓ 2 double crochets in 1 stitch (2 dc in 1 st)

US crochet terms

Yarn:

"Colour Crafter" yarn by Scheepjes 100% premium acrylic – DK – 300 m in 100 g (328 yards in 3 ½ ounces)

can be replaced with the following yarn quality, or other similar DK yarns:

Stylecraft "Special DK" yarn 100% premium acrylic – 295 m in 100 g (322 yards in 3 ½ ounces)



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Choose a color for the flamenco dress.

With the color you have chosen for the dress, ch 4 and ss 1 to join.

Round 1: ch 2 (counts as first dc), dc 9 in ring, ss 1 to join round (10).

Round 2: ch 2 (counts as first dc), *dc 2 in next st, dc 1 in following st*, repeat from *to* to end of round, ss 1 to join (15).

Round 3 up to and including **round 5**: ch 2 (counts as first dc), dc 1 in each st to end of round, ss 1 to join (15).

Round 6: ch 2 (counts as first dc) and dc 5 in first st, dc 6 in each st around, ss 1 to join (90). This will result in a wavy ruffle.

Round 7: ch 2 (counts as first dc), dc 1 in each st to end of round, ss 1 to join (90).

Two additional ruffles

Work a round of surface single crochet stitches done by picking up the stitches between rounds 3 and 4 (photo 1), for a total of 15 surface single crochet stitches. Ss 1 to join (15).

These surface single crochet stitches are all done while holding the yarn above the surface of the fabric.

Round 1 of middle ruffle: repeat round 6 (photo 2).

Round 2 of middle ruffle: repeat round 7.

For the top ruffle. work another round of surface single crochet stitches done by picking up the stitches between rounds 1 and 2 (photo 3) of the base, for a total of 10 surface single crochet stitches. Ss 1 to join (10).

Repeat rounds 1 and 2 on top ruffle, as done for middle ruffle.

Edging on all ruffles: using a contrasting color, attach yarn and sc 1 in each stitch around the edge of each ruffle (photo 4 / diagram on page 4).



Body

The body is crocheted bottom-up from the base, using the same color chosen for the dress. Start by working another round of surface single crochet stitches done once more by picking up the stitches between rounds 1 and 2 (photo 5), for a total of 10 surface single crochet stitches. Ss 1 to join round (10).

Round 2 up to and including round 4: ch 1 (counts as first sc), sc 1 in each st to end of round, ss 1 to join (10). Cut yarn, work in ends and change color – choose a skincolored shade of yarn to your liking.

Round 5 up to and including round 12: ch 1 (counts as first sc), sc 1 in each st to end of round, ss 1 to join (10).

Fill the body and head with toy stuffing or fiberfill.

Close off the top section of the head by basting a length of same-colored yarn in and out across the top of round 12 and pulling the two ends tightly together. Knot them firmly to give the top of the head a nicely rounded form. To shape the neck, baste a length of same colored yarn in and out across the top of round 8 and knot the two ends together, closing them enough to form a separation between the head and the upper body (photo 7).











Top ruffle of flamenco dress

The top ruffle of the dress is crocheted and sewn on separately.

With the color chosen for the dress, ch 14, skip 1 st, then sc 3 in each st across.

Choose another color for the edging, ch 1 to attach yarn then sc 1 in each stitch across (photo 8).

Stitch the narrow ends of this ruffle together then position top section of ruffle to body, stitching it all around the neckline and shoulders with neat, invisible stitches (photo 9).

Arms

For the arms, chain 10 (make 2). Stitch the arms onto the body as shown in the pattern photos.





Hairdo

With the color chosen for the hair ch 26, ch 1 to turn, then sc 3 in each stitch across (21)up until the last 5 ch. Sc 1 in each one of these remaining chains and cut yarn. Sew flatter end of braids to head, then wrap the rest of the braids (the curls) into a bun or other hairdo to your liking, and fasten with tight, neat stitches.





To form a mini flower decoration for the hair, ch 3, ss 1 to join.

Sew the mini flowers on either as shown in the pattern photos or to your liking.

Using a yarn needle, embroider **mouth and eyes** onto the face, either as shown in the pattern photos or to your own individual liking.

With some strands of gold or silver colored thread, you can also embroider a **necklace** or bracelets.

Your Flamenco egg cozy is ready to tango!
